

## Safety Issues for Chapter Rides

1. Riders Edge Course: for all Road Captains every year, mandatory
2. Advanced Rider Course: for all Road Captains, mandatory. (within 2 years )
3. Accident Response Course: for all Road Captains, suggested'
4. One Road Captain for every nine riders per ride.
5. A minimum of One sweep rider per chapter ride. (To be in each group.)
6. Ride groups will depart at 3 to 5 minute intervals (so as not to catch the forward group and defeat the purpose of a small group. )(except for police escort )
7. Road Captains will maintain a staggered formation, or single file formation based on road conditions, terrain, and weather.
- 8, Road Captains should do a pre-trip ride of the route to be taken
9. Road Captains should do a pre-trip meeting with riders to resolve any issues or concerns about the ride, (hand signals, staggered formation, rider ability, route and destination, type of roads, distance.)
10. Bike inspections by each group Road Captain. (Check list as per Head Road Captain)
11. Ride maps for all Road Captains for each ride. Route and destination.
12. Emergency medical kits for each Road Captain on each ride
13. All Road Captains should have some source of communication, (cell phone, CB.)
14. Road Captains should have the cell phone numbers of other Road Captains for each ride and the number of ZIP'S HD.
15. Road Captains should not exceed the speed limits on chapter rides.
16. Road Captains should not block traffic unless ok is given by law enforcement
17. Road Captains are responsible for the signing of release forms by non-chapter members and invited guests for each chapter ride.
18. Road Captains have the right to cancel any ride due to any safety issue.
19. Road Captains have the right to eliminate any rider from a ride due to safety issues. (Rider ability, health, mechanical, rider antics, (no hands, burnouts ).
20. ZERO tolerance for drugs and alcohol before and during any chapter ride.
21. Road Captains should display their chapter rockers for each chapter ride, as well as arm bands to identify their part in the rides.
